Publication Ethics and Publication Malpractice Statement

European Journal of Social Science Education and Research (EJSER) is a multidisciplinary, open-access, peer-reviewed journal dedicated to publishing high-quality research in the social sciences, education, and related fields. EJSER is committed to upholding the highest standards of publication ethics and integrity. We adhere to the principles outlined by the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE) and other international standards to ensure the quality, transparency, and credibility of our journal. This statement outlines the ethical responsibilities of all parties involved in the publication process, including authors, reviewers, editors, and the publisher.

1. Responsibilities of Authors

- Originality and Plagiarism: Authors must ensure that their submissions are
 original works and have not been published elsewhere. Proper attribution must
 be given to the works of others, and any form of plagiarism, including selfplagiarism, is strictly prohibited. Submissions must not be under review

- Disclosure of Conflicts of Interest: Authors must disclose any financial or personal relationships that could influence the research or its interpretation.

- **Acknowledgment of Sources**: Proper acknowledgment of the work of others must always be provided. Authors should cite publications that have been influential in shaping their research.
- Language and Style: Submissions must be in English, and authors are responsible for ensuring the language quality of their manuscripts.

2. Responsibilities of Reviewers

- Confidentiality: Reviewers must treat all manuscripts as confidential documents and must not share or use any information from the manuscript for personal gain.
- **Objectivity and Constructiveness**: Reviews should be conducted objectively, with no personal criticism of the author. Reviewers should provide constructive feedback to help improve the quality of the manuscript.
- **Timeliness**: Reviewers should complete their evaluations within the agreed timeframe. If a reviewer cannot meet the deadline, they should notify the editor promptly.
